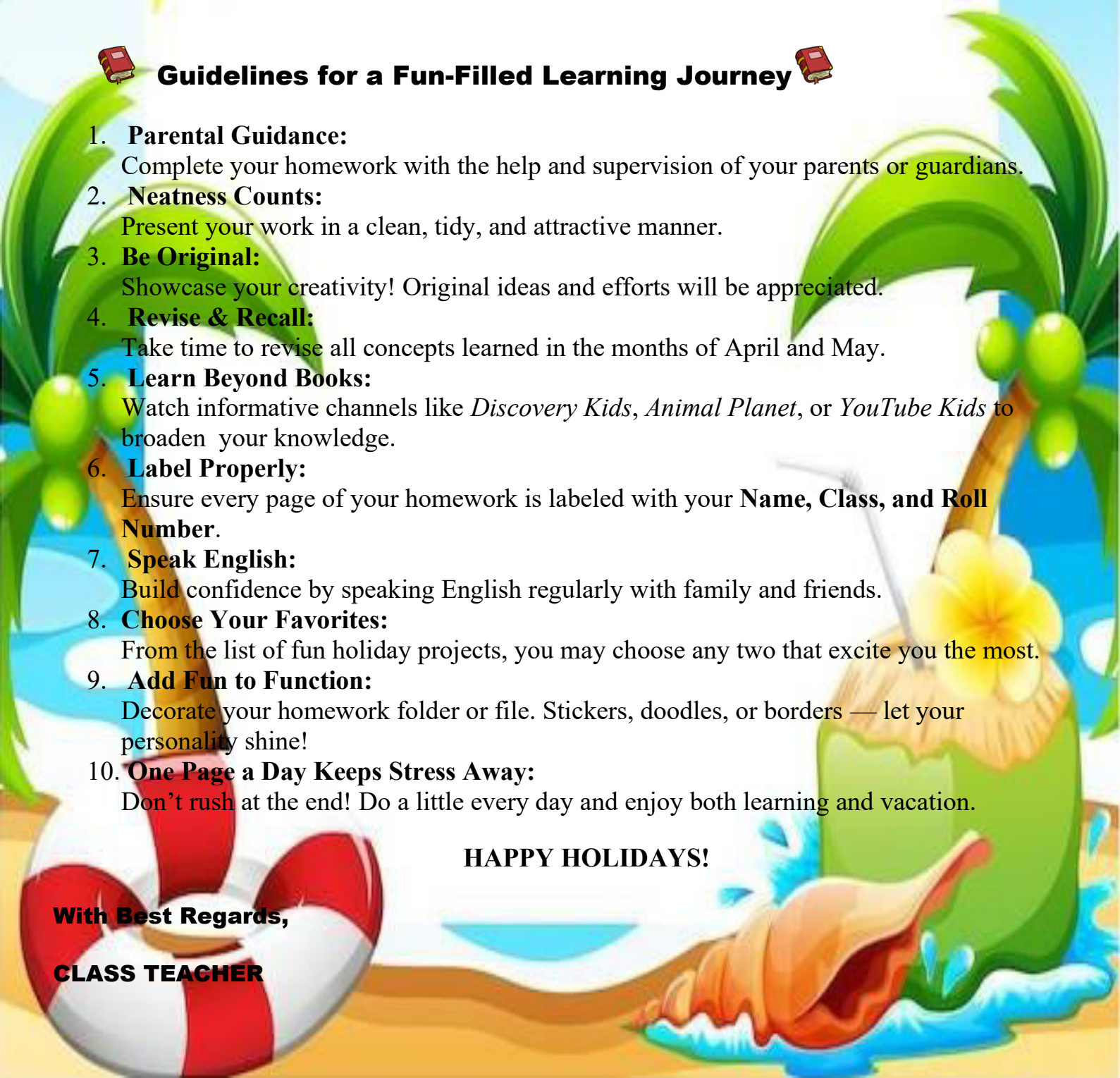


- 1. Parental Guidance:**

- Matching Game:** Create a set of cards with pictures and descriptions (e.g., wheelchair, hearing aid, orphanage, hospital). Match each picture to its description and explain its use

- The Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep Islands

5. Community helpers

Activities:-

- Write a short story or draw a comic strip about how people in a community help each other and why teamwork is important
- Make a poster about safety rules everyone should follow in the community (like traffic rules, fire safety, etc.)

Art integrated project, pairing of states (uttar pradesh with manipur)

Visual Art:

Create a dual-state collage featuring traditional attire, monuments, and festivals.

Draw or paint folk art: Madhubani (UP) vs. Meitei designs (Manipur).

Crafts:

Make clay models of Taj Mahal and Kangla Fort.

Create bamboo or paper crafts inspired by Manipuri techniques.
