***Theme: Science in my kitchen.***

All cooking is science. it involves chemistry physics and STEM. Use of heat, cold and cutting changes the composition of foods. Even simply slicing an apple sets off chemical reactions that change the colour of the apple's flesh. However, there are some cooking methods that delve into even deeper and stranger territory. here are some interesting science experiments for our kids. With the help and guide of parents they can do these simple experiments in their summer break.



## Week 1: Orange buoyancy experiment.

In this experiment an orange with its peel will float in water and after peeling it will sink.

Step: 1. Take a glass/bowl of water. Put an orange in water. It will float.

2. peel the orange and again put it in water. This time it will sink.

3. make a video of this experiment with child while he is performing this experiment.

## Week 2: Tissue paper apple.

**Steps: 1.** Take an apple template (printed or drawn), tissue paper (red, green, brown), glue, and scissors.




























2. glue small pieces of tissue paper onto the apple shape, crinkling the paper for texture( in case of using white tissue paper, make dots on the tissue paper with acrylic colour or sketch pens. Dab water to the dots. Slowly the tissue will become colourful)

**Steps:** It is a fun and educational activity where participants search for specific food items based on alphabet/phonetic sound.

### **Fire work in a jar:**

#### **Instructions:**

##### **1. Fill the jar with water:**

Fill the jar about three-quarters full with water.

##### **2. Combine oil and food colouring:**

Pour a small amount of oil into a separate bowl or container. Add a few drops of food colouring, one or two colours at a time.

##### **3. Mix gently:**

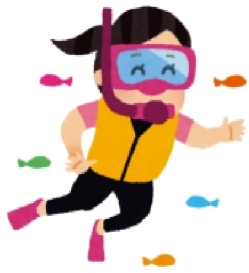
Use a fork to gently mix the oil and food colouring, breaking the food colouring into smaller droplets.

##### **4. Slowly pour into the jar:**

Carefully pour the oil mixture into the jar of water. The oil will float on top of the water, and the food colouring will gradually sink and mix, creating the firework effect.



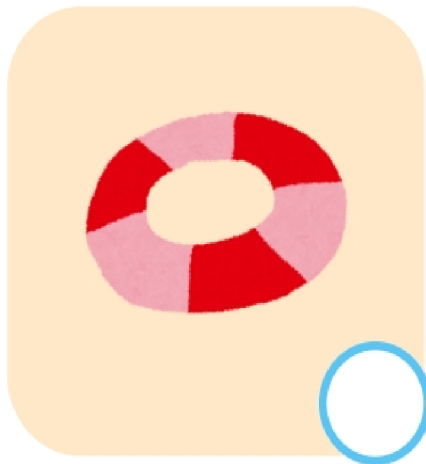

**Sam and Dot Practice and Read**

Book 4 Part 1 of the Series 1 introduces simple three-letter words with short 'o' sound like dot, got, lot, and pot.

New phonic element : Short 'o'

Reviewed phonic element : Short 'a', short 'e' and short 'i'

Short Vowel Rule : When there is one vowel in a word, either at the beginning or between two consonants, it usually has a short vowel sound.

Let's practise pronouncing the short vowel 'o' words from the story using the phonic rule for short vowel 'o' sound.

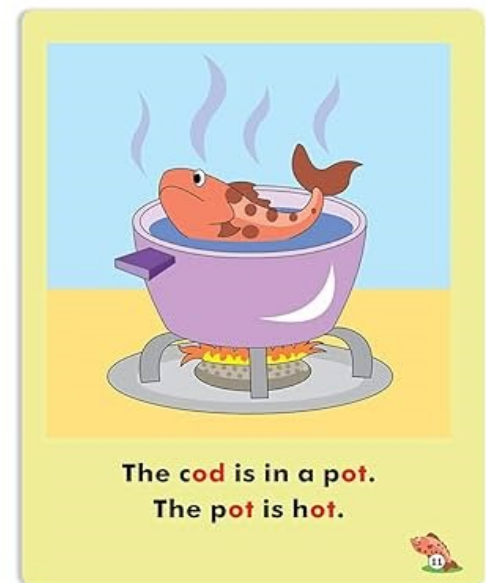
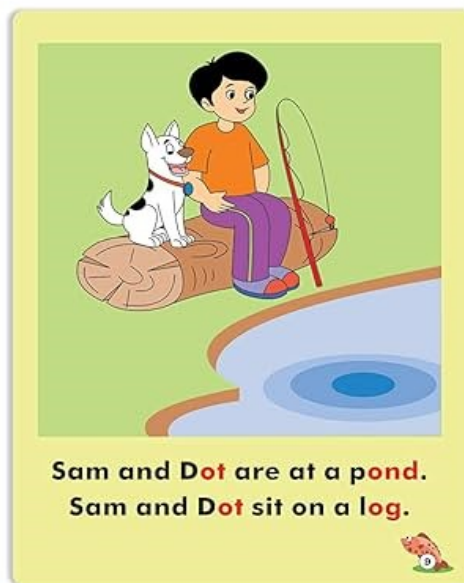
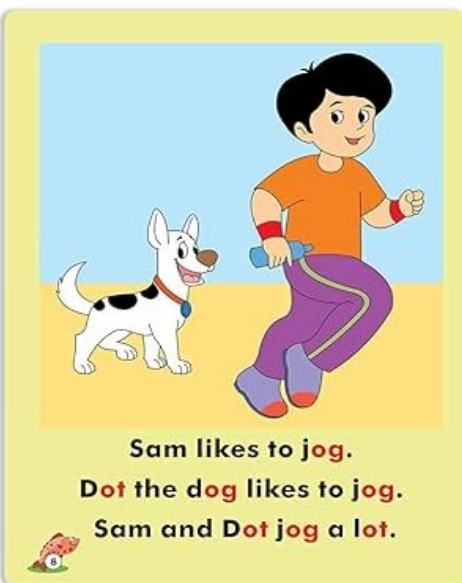
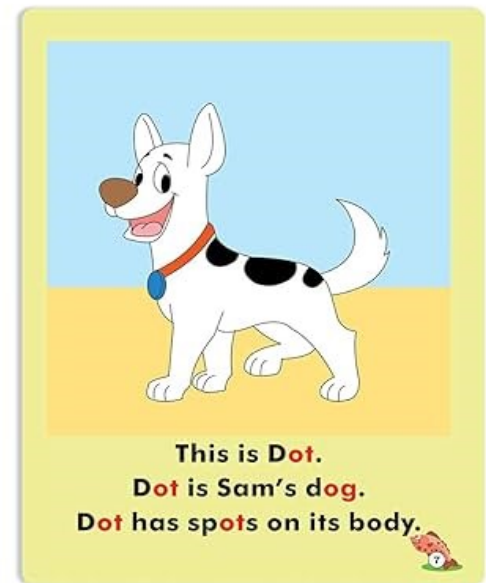
