

Instructions for Parents

- Assist your child where necessary, but let them explore.
- Maintain a scrapbook/folder to paste pictures, drawings, and completed work.

Week 1: Me and My Family



- 1. 1. My Family Tree Paste or draw pictures of family members and label them (Mom, Dad, etc.).
- 2. 2. Photo Day Take a picture of your child helping at home (watering plants, folding clothes). Paste it with the caption: 'I help at home!'
- 3. 3. All About Me Video Record a 30-second video of your child saying: 'My name is ___. I am ___ years old. I like to ___.'

Week 2: Nature Explorers



Leaf Collage - Collect different leaves and paste them creatively in a scrapbook.
 My Sunshine Art - Make a sun using a paper plate or yellow handprints. Write: 'The sun gives us light and warmth.'



3. Listen to Nature - Go on a nature walk. What sounds do you hear? (birds, wind, etc.) Draw or paste images of what you heard.

Week 3: My Little Skills

1. Alphabet Hunt at Home - Find 5 objects starting with A, B, and C. Paste or draw pictures (e.g., A - Apple, B - Ball).

2. Count and Paste - Count 5 spoons, 4 socks, 3 toys, 2 shoes, 1 ball. Take pictures or draw and paste in your scrapbook.

3. Tearing and Pasting Shapes - Tear colored paper and paste it inside basic shapes like circle, triangle, square.



Phonics & Sound Activities: Let's Play with Sounds!

Sound Safari - Go around your home and find 3 items each for sounds /a/, /b/, /c/.
 Paste or draw them under the heading 'My Sound Safari.'
 Sing the Sound Song - Sing to the tune of 'Twinkle Twinkle':

A says /a/ as in apple pie, B says /b/ like a buzzing fly, C says /k/ like a crunchy corn, D says /d/ like a loud drum horn!

3. Sound Sorting Game - Match pictures (Apple, Ball, Cat, Dog) with their sounds: A /a/, B /b/, etc.

4. What's That Sound? - Parent says a sound like /m/. Child names a word: Mango! Clap and cheer!

5. Phonic Treasure Box - Create a weekly letter box. For letter A, find small objects or draw pictures (Apple, Ant).

Week 4: Colour and Create

1.**Bubble Wrap Printing-** Wrap bubble wrap around a rolling pin or bottle, dip it in paint, and roll it across paper to create colorful patterns and textures.




2. **My Favourite Food** - Draw or make with clay your favourite food. Talk about the colour and taste.

3. **Story Time Drawing** - Read one picture book daily. Draw your favourite part of any story.

- Recyclable items and flashcards


STEM: Observe a sunflower- colour it using yellow crayon.



- Read the same story repeatedly. Children often enjoy reading the same books multiple times, as it helps them become familiar with the language and story.
- Make reading a regular part of your daily routine, such as before bedtime or during a quiet time.
