Welcome to your summer holiday homework! This time, get ready for a journey full of fun, creativity, and discovery. Each activity is designed to spark your imagination, help you learn new things, and make your holidays memorable. Let's turn every day into an adventure!

1. Reading Time: Dive Into Stories.

Read any storybook or children's magazine daily for 15 minutes. Choose from classics like *Panchatantra Tales*, *Akbar and Birbal*, *Amar Chitra Katha* or your school's reading material.

ACTIVITY: Create a Reading Log (at least 5 entries). For each story, draw your favorite scene and write a line about what you liked most.

Organize a "Story Hour" at home—read aloud to your family or record yourself narrating a story with different voices for each character!

Hand writing Practice: Make Words Dance!

- Paste a cut-out or draw a picture (from magazines, newspapers, or your own imagination).
- Write 5-6 sentences about it. Themes could be:

ACTIVITY: Create a comic strip with your picture as the first frame—what happens next? Draw and write the next two scenes.

* Host a “Picture Gallery” at home—display your compositions and invite your family to guess the story behind each one!

2.Stone Age Storybook

Task: Write and make a short video about a day in the life of an early human. Include their adventures, challenges, and discoveries.

3.Model Making: Globe with Latitude and Longitude

- Students can create a 3D model of the Earth (a globe) using materials like a ball, paper mache, or cardboard.
- Mark and label the Equator, Prime Meridian, Tropic of Cancer, Tropic of Capricorn, Arctic Circle, and Antarctic Circle.
- Draw and label important continents, oceans, and a few major countries.
- Clearly show lines of latitude and longitude.

Every day, go outside (or look from your window) and write your nature observations.

Here's what to include on each page:

Daily Page Format:

- * Date: _____
- * Weather Today: (Sunny / Rainy / Cloudy / Windy / Cold / Hot)
- * Where I was: (e.g., garden, park, balcony)
- * What I observed:
- *  A plant/tree/leaf (name, color, shape)
- *  A bird/animal/insect (what was it doing?)
- * New Word I Learned: (A word related to nature, with its meaning)

Make a mini 3D project showing 5 different types of plants (Herbs, Shrubs, Trees, Climbers, Creepers).

Include pictures (drawn or pasted), names, and one interesting fact about each.
